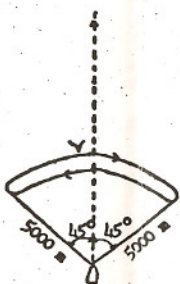
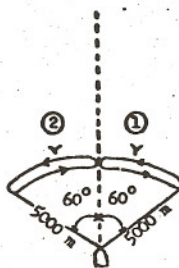
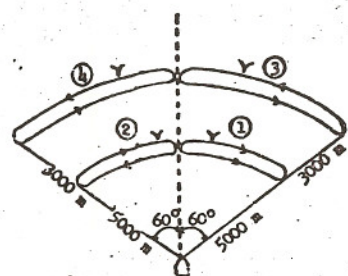

Duration of one patrol will be approximately three hours, relief will be made at a designated position.</li> <li>2. Standard altitude will be 300-500 m.</li> <li>3. The airplane (unit) commander may so reduce his range from the ship (or ships) being directly escorted that he will be within sight when visibility is reduced.</li> <li>4.  The depth of two search was 40 miles out & flown at no greater height than 2500 feet
